




# Marin Headlands Trails



**Alternative A: No Action (36 CFR 2.15, 36 CFR 7.97 (d); 1979 Pet Policy; GGNRA Compendium)**

Dog walking would continue to be allowed on-leash or under voice control on the Coastal Trail from Golden Gate Bridge to Hill 88, which includes the Lagoon Trail; the Coastal, Wolf Ridge, Miwok Loop; and the Old Bunker Fire Road Loop. Dog walking would also continue to be allowed on-leash on the Coastal Trail from Hill 88 to Muir Beach, the Battery Smith-Guthrie Fire Road Loop, the South Rodeo Beach Trail, the North Miwok Trail from Tennessee Valley to Highway One, and the County View Trail.

**Alternative B: NPS Leash Regulation (36 CFR 2.15 and GGNRA Compendium)**

Under Alternative B, dog walking would not be allowed on the Marin Headlands Trails.

**Alternative C: Emphasis on Multiple Use Balanced by County**

Dog walking would be allowed on-leash on the Lower Rodeo Valley Trail Corridor from Rodeo Beach parking lot to the intersection of Bunker and McCullough Roads via the Lagoon, Miwok, and Rodeo Valley Trails; the Old Bunker Fire Road Loop, and the Battery Smith-Guthrie Fire Road Loop.

**Alternative D: Most Protective Based on Resource Protection and Visitor Safety**

Same as Alternative B.

**Alternative E: Most Dog Walking Access and Management Intensive**

Dog walking would be allowed on-leash on the Old Bunker Fire Road Loop, the Battery Smith-Guthrie Fire Road Loop, the Lower Rodeo Valley Trail Corridor, and the Coastal Trail Bike Route (which includes Julian Fire Road) from 101 to Rodeo Beach parking lot.

**Preferred Alternative:**  
Dog walking would be allowed on-leash on the Lower Rodeo Valley Trail Corridor from Rodeo Beach parking lot to the intersection of Bunker and McCullough Roads via the Lagoon, Miwok, and Rodeo Valley Trails, the Old Bunker Fire Road Loop, and the Battery Smith-Guthrie Fire Road Loop.
