

Curry Village Rockfall Hazard Zone Structures

Existing Conditions Photos

The following are representative photos of the structures that remain within the area closed in 2008 following rockfall events at Curry Village within Yosemite Valley of Yosemite National Park. The National Park Service is currently undergoing a planning process to determine the future of the 72 structures within the closed rockfall hazard zone. There are 21 historic **bungalows or cabins with bath** (c.1920) remaining in the rockfall hazard zone. Before their closure in 2008, they were used for guest accommodations.



The **Rufus Green** bungalow (1922) is slightly larger, has a chimney, and different interior floor plan than other bungalows. It was used for guest accommodations before it was closed in 2008.



There are 44 **bungalows or cabins without baths** (c. 1930), previously used for guest accommodations, remaining in the rockfall hazard zone.



The **Terrace Comfort Station** (pre 1925) is one of two comfort stations remaining in the rockfall hazard zone.



The **Rock Comfort Station** (1935) is one of two comfort stations remaining in the rockfall hazard zone.



Built against the base of the talus, a large boulder projects through the rear of the **Foster Curry Bungalow (Tresidder House)** (1916).



Cabin 101 (Nob Hill House) (c.1925) is located behind the Nob Hill Shower House and was used for employee housing before it was closed in 2008.



Women's Club/Terrace Clubhouse (c.1922) was used by concessioner employees before it was closed in 2008.

Non-historic buildings



The **Nob Hill Showerhouse** (nonhistoric building, 1993) was built in a similar location as the original shower house that was demolished following debris flow damage in 1986.

Photo not available: **Bungalow 61** (c.1980s), one of the 22 bungalows remaining in the rockfall zone is non-historic. It was built after the original bungalow was destroyed in a fire.
