
The long-toed salamander is naturally one of the top predators in mountain lake ecosystems in North Cascades National Park Complex.



Monitoring results indicate tailed frogs are returning after fish are removed.



Due to their high rate of reproduction and ability to out compete other species, fish over-populate the ecosystem. Eventually they consume most of the food resources in a lake stunting their growth.
