

5 Photographs: General Area Encompassed by Draft Environmental Assessment, 2013, George Washington Boyhood Home National Historic Landmark (NHL)



Ferry Farm, present conditions (mapped on p. 29 of Environmental Assessment): overall view looking northwest from visitor center towards Washington Home Archaeological Site beside 1870's Agricultural Building (white structure in right-middleground), and across Rappahannock River to City of Fredericksburg (background). Conditions proposed in preferred alternative (mapped on p. 46) would include replacing visitor center on-site with a less-obtrusive visitor center behind vegetative screening, and moving 1870's agricultural building to a less-obtrusive location out of view to the left-rear of this photo. Quarry pit and proposed sites of new Administrative- and Maintenance buildings also out of view to the left-rear of this photo.



Ferry Farm, present conditions, looking southeast from Washington Home Archaeological Site, past restrooms-building, to visitor center in background. Conditions proposed in preferred alternative (mapped on p. 46) would include removing restrooms-building, and replacing visitor center on-site with a less-obtrusive structure.





Ferry Farm, present conditions: view looking east from Washington Home Archaeological Site and along gravel entrance-driveway, towards commercial development on Route Three/King's Highway. Conditions proposed in preferred alternative (mapped on p. 46) would include removing the driveway and planting vegetative screening along Route Three.
