
Project Background

- General Francis Marion was a Revolutionary War officer from Berkeley County, SC and generally credited as the father of Guerilla Warfare
- Section 331 of PL 110-229, the Consolidated Natural Resources Act of 2008, authorizes the Marion Park Project to establish a commemorative work on federal land in the District
- Francis Marion Memorial Project, in cooperation with NPS, seeks to establish a memorial
- Site Selection Study evaluated 6 sites along South Carolina Avenue in Southeast DC

Site Evaluation Criteria

- Suitability of size and configuration
- Compatibility with existing park infrastructure and uses
- Compatibility with adjacent land uses
- Thematic link to Francis Marion
- Visibility and accessibility of site to pedestrians and transit users
- Presence of potential infrastructure barriers (or lack thereof)
- Lack of mature and/or dense vegetation

Purpose and Need


- Purpose of the Memorial
 - To establish a permanent memorial to Gen. Francis
 Marion and recognize his contributions to United
 States history

What is NEPA?

National Environmental Policy Act of 1969

(NEPA; Public Law 91-190; 42 U.S.C. 4321 et seq)

- Established a national policy for protecting the environment and requires evaluation of alternative actions
- Goal: To ensure informed decision-making
- Can conclude with an EA and Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI) or an EIS and Record of Decision (ROD)




What is Section 106?


Component of National Historic Preservation Act of 1966

(NHPA; Public Law 89-665; 16 U.S.C. 470 et seq.)


- Established a process to protect resources listed on, or eligible for listing on, the National Register of Historic Places, and requires the consideration of alternatives if effects on historic resources are anticipated
- Goal: To minimize potential harm and damage to historic properties
- Can conclude in a Determination of No Adverse Effect or a Memorandum of Agreement with Consulting Parties





NEPA and Section 106 – Agency Processes

The NPS, in cooperation with the NCPC, is evaluating an updated NEPA and Section 106 process for this memorial's site and design. The purpose of this revised process is to better align and support key decision points associated with each agency's NEPA and Section 106 responsibilities, and to ensure that the review is commensurate with the complexity of the project. The NPS and NCPC are proposing a scoping meeting for memorial sites at this time and will be scoping for the design of the memorial at a later date. Following both scoping periods, an EA will be created to document potential environmental impacts. This is a deviation from NCPC's existing Environmental and Historic Preservation Procedures, which requires separate NEPA and Section 106 processes for site selection and the design of the memorial. 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
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Site Selection Process


- Began evaluating sites in 2014
- Identified 6 sites for consideration along South Carolina Avenue, SE
 - 5 sites under District of Columbia jurisdiction
 - 1 National Park Service site



- District jurisdiction


