
Park Significance

The convergence of the San Andreas Fault, San Francisco Bay at the Golden Gate, and the California coast line creates a dynamic landscape and environment of exceptional scientific value.

The undeveloped remnant coastal corridor of marine, estuarine, and terrestrial ecosystems supports exceptional native biodiversity and provides a refuge for one of the largest concentration of rare, threatened, and endangered species in the
