Dear Mr. May:

The National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA) Section 106 Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) for the Dwight D. Eisenhower Memorial was executed on March 1, 2012 and remains valid for five years until March 1, 2017. During the valid five-year period, the NPS is required to update the MOA Signatories, invited Signatory(ies), Consulting Parties, and the public on the Memorial and the actions taken to implement the terms of the MOA.

Specifically, the Eisenhower Memorial MOA includes stipulations that addressed the final design of the memorial and a design consultation process. As a result of the consultation process, design changes were made as delineated in the letter from the Eisenhower Memorial Commission (EMC) to NPS dated October 15, 2014.

NPS issued a final determination of effects on May 8, 2015. The DC SHPO reviewed the determination and concurred in a letter of May 22, 2015. As a result, the design was presented to the CFA on June 18, 2015 and received Final Approval at that time. The project was then presented at the NCPC on July 9, 2015 and received Final Approval. Given that the final design has been approved and construction documents have been prepared, the stipulations related to design have been complied with. Additional terms of the MOA addressed the E-Memorial, onsite interpretation, and other nominations and studies. The status of these items is as follows:

The web-based E-Memorial is currently in development and the site information requested is currently on the EMC website; a contract has been let for the Historic American Landscape Survey (HALS) documentation; a nomination for the Lyndon Baines Johnson Department of Education Building is currently being prepared by GSA; and the Eisenhower Memorial Commission is in the process of providing funds to the DC SHPO to research and update the National Register Nomination for the Plan of the City of Washington.

The NCPC has completed its assessment study for a self-guided Southwest Federal Center heritage trail.

The EMC anticipates that the Commission will remain in compliance and fulfill the last remaining stipulation in the upcoming year.
