## Fire Program History/Timeline

## History of Fires on Ocean Beach:

- 1975 NPS inherits longstanding SF tradition of beach fires at Ocean Beach
- 1983 CFR 36 §2.13(a)(1): Superintendent designates Ocean Beach for fires
- 2002 CCSF Commission on the Environment passes resolution 001-02, requests GGNRA "create an effective system that reduces [beach fire] impacts."
- 2004 NPS limits fires to the area between stairwells 15 and 28
- 2005 NPS proposed banning fires on Ocean Beach
- 2006 NPS receives more than 3,000 individual comments largely in opposition to the proposed ban of fires on Ocean Beach
- 2007 NPS institutes a one-year Pilot that limits fires to newly installed fire rings between stairwells 15-20, and caps groups sizes at 25 people per fire ring, except by permit.
- 2014 NPS institutes a Revised Pilot Program with 12 fire rings, 9:00 pm curfew, and prohibition of fires on summer and winter Spare the Air Days
- 2015 February public meeting: Revised Pilot Program summary and next steps

## Current Program Planning Timeline:

- Public Meeting at County Fair Building September 24, 2015
- Proposal Released October 22, 2015, followed by 44-day comment period
- Final Program Signed and Released February 19, 2016
- Compendium Effective Date (Implementation began) April 4, 2016
- Signs & Liaisons Stakeholder Workshop July 13, 2016
- First No Burn Season began November 1, 2016
- Today: First Annual Public Open House February 16th, 2017



## 12 Program Elements

All Elements are required and rely on each other to ensure a sustainable program:

#### 1. Permit System

- No permits required for groups under 25 people
- Special Use Permits will continue to be required for groups of 25 people or larger

#### 2. Burn Season

- Fires allowed March 1st October 31st (8 Months)
- No fires November 1st through end of February
  - Matches Bay Area Air Quality Management District's winter Spare the Air season
  - When public demand for beach fires is low
- Comprehensive cleaning of the beach following removal of fire rings

#### 3. Partnership with San Francisco Recreation and Parks Department (SFRPD)

- Continuation of support for public outreach and education
- Additional maintenance support, including trash collection

#### 4. Replace Fire Rings

- Added four rings (from 12 to 16 total)
- Testing new designs, stenciled with rules

#### 5. Replace Signage

- Replace complex messaging with simpler designs
- Add on-beach signs adjacent to fire ring area

#### 6. Enforcement

- Joint NPS Rangers and United States Park Police enforcement
- Education periods followed by enforcement

#### 7. Public Outreach and Education

- Updated website and flyers with new program information
- Email notifications, Social Media posts, and Press Releases
- Beach Fire Liaison Program: Interpretive Rangers and Volunteers help to spread the word about how to have a responsible fire

#### 8. Curfew Time

• 9:30 pm (previously 9:00 pm) provides almost 1 hour of after-sunset burn time on summer solstice

#### 9. Summer Spare the Air days

• Continued from Revised Pilot Program, fires banned during summer Spare the Air days

#### 10. Revised Data Collection and Monitoring

• Periodic, sample-based monitoring revised from methods used during Revised Pilot Program

#### 11. Ongoing Program Evaluation

• Evaluate the program and share information with the public on an annual basis during the No-Burn season

#### 12. Age Requirement

• "Responsible leader" age for supervision of minors dropped from 21 to 18









