The Executive Leadership Team has reviewed the proposed project/action and completed its environmental assessment documentation, and we have determined the following:

- There will not be any effect on threatened, endangered, or rare species and/or their critical habitat.
- There will be no adverse effect on historical, cultural, or archeological resources.
- There will not be serious or long-term undesirable environmental or visual effects.

The subject proposed project, therefore, is now cleared for all NEPA and NHPA compliance requirements as presented above. Project plans and specifications are approved and construction and/or project implementation can commence.

For the proposed project actions to be within compliance requirements during construction and/or project implementation, the following mitigations must be adhered to:

- If decomposed granite is imported, use an approved weed-free aggregate source. Consult with Garrett Dickman if there are questions.

### Recommendations for Conditions or Stipulations:

All of the work will happen in previously disturbed areas and on top of the ground surface. There will be no ground disturbing activities that will require archeological monitoring.

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## Categorical Exclusion Form

**Project:** 2017-006 Wawona Campground Site Accessibility Enhancement

**Description of Action (Project Description):**

This project will modify four campsites (67, 69, 70, and 89) in loop C of the Wawona Campground to enhance accessibility. Each site will be equipped with accessible food storage lockers, fire rings, wooden picnic tables with galvanized steel frames, attached bench seating, and extended accessible table tops.

The accessibility enhancements will also include installation of a hardened campsite surface in campsites #89 and #67 to stabilize the campsite surface and improvements to the path of travel from the accessible restroom to the campsites. Decomposed granite will be used as surface material for the two added accessible pathways from campsites #89 and #67 to the accessible bathroom (building 4067). The project will also involve removing the underutilized campsite platforms to allow campers the freedom to place their tent wherever they would like, adding decomposed granite accessible parking pads (sites #89 and #67), and relocating camp site #89 closer to the accessible bathroom.

The accessible pathways are 4 feet wide and approximately 50 to 60 feet long and 3 inches deep depending on the grade.


