








Figure 2 Ahwahnee Sweet Shop, showing current, non-ADA compliant layout (plan view)




Figure 3 Ahwahnee Sweet Shop, showing proposed ADA candy counter new magazine rack




Figure 4 Ahwahnee Sweet Shop, showing proposed ADA compliant layout (plan view)
