


- Visitor Contact Station Services
 - Comfort Station (restrooms)
 - Information / Trip Planning
 - Wilderness Permits

- Campground Reservations
- Bookstore / Bear Canister Rental
- Mather District Law Enforcement



Existing Conditions

- Visitor Contact Station
 - Piecemeal collection of structures
 - Confusing for visitors
 - Poor condition
 - Congested interior space
 - Inadequate opportunities for self-help information



- Inadequate size
- No meeting / training space
- Remote from ambulance bay
- Inadequate ambulance storage
- Inadequate parking for Ranger vehicles







Existing Conditions

- Parking
 - Congested during peak times
 - Lacks marked pedestrian crossings
 - Limited parking for large vehicles
 - Poor / inadequate signage
 - Ranger & Law Enforcement vehicles often blocked



- Undersized
- Poor condition
- Leach field at end of useful life
- Utilities
 - Require upgrades or replacement





Proposed Action

- Replace the ExistingVisitor Contact Station
 - Improve parking / signage / safety
 - Place visitor services in one building: Information / Wilderness Permits / Campground Reservations / Bookstore / Bear Canister Rental
 - Provide more opportunities for selfhelp information
 - Construct a larger comfort station
 - Construct sanitary sewer toHodgdon Meadow Campground





Proposed Action

Construct an Emergency Services Facility at Hodgdon site







Proposed Action

- Construct an Emergency Services Facility at Hodgdon
 - Two Ambulance Bays
 - Visitor Protection Offices
 - Emergency Services Meeting / Training Space





Proposed Action: Environmental Impacts

- National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA)
 - Park is developing an Environmental Assessment
- National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA)
 - Park is consulting with the California State Historic Preservation
 Office (SHPO) and traditionally associated tribes and groups
- Impact topics resulting from the proposed action could include:
 - Cultural resources
 - Vegetation
 - Wildlife
 - Visitor Experience

Project Timeline

- Planning Phase
 - **★** Public Scoping (NOW) Closes June 4, 2018
 - NPS Drafts Alternatives & Environmental Assessment Summer and Fall 2018
 - Release of Environmental Assessment for Public review Late 2018
 - NPS reviews public comments Late 2018
 - Release of Decision Document Early 2019
- Construction Phase
 - Phased Construction Begins Summer 2019
