### ADDENDUM 2

WHEREAS, the District of Columbia Water and Sewer Authority (DC Water), the National Park Service National Capital Region (NPS), Joint Base Anacostia Bolling (JBAB), and the District of Columbia State Historic Preservation Office (DC SHPO) executed a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) on February\_\_\_\_\_, 2011, taking into account the effects of the DC Water proposal to construct the Anacostia River Projects to control Combined Sewer Overflows (CSOs) in Washington, DC; and

WHEREAS the same parties have agreed, that an amendment to this MOA specifying that the Naval District Washington (NDW) owns and retains transfer rights to any archaeological resources found on Joint Base Anacostia Bolling (JBAB) property, should be executed;

NOW, THEREFORE, the above-referenced MOA signed on February \_\_\_\_ 2011 is amended by replacing Stipulation VI with the following:

VI. Records and Collections – NPS and DC Water shall ensure that all records resulting from survey and excavation at the Poplar Point site are curated according to the curation standards documented in the Guidelines for Archaeological Investigations in the District of Columbia (April 1998), and that all artifacts and other material resulting from the same survey and excavation are maintained in accordance with these guidelines. DC SHPO will take possession of project records and collections from District Government owned parcels and for agencies that have no collection plans of their own.

NPS and DC Water shall ensure that all records from survey and excavation at the JBAB site shall be curated according to the stipulations contained within the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) dated August 15, 2005, and as further amended on August 9, 2010

between the Maryland Archaeological Conservation Laboratory (MAC Lab) and NDW. The MOU allows NDW to curate and store archaeological collections recovered on NDW installations, including JBAB, at the MAC Lab facility in St. Leonard, Maryland. The MOU was prepared pursuant to authorization established by 36 CFR Part 79 – Curation of Federally Owned and Administered Archaeological Collections and 10 U.S.C 2684 (Title 10, Armed Forces, Chapter 159, Section 2684, Cooperative Agreements for Management of Cultural Resources).
