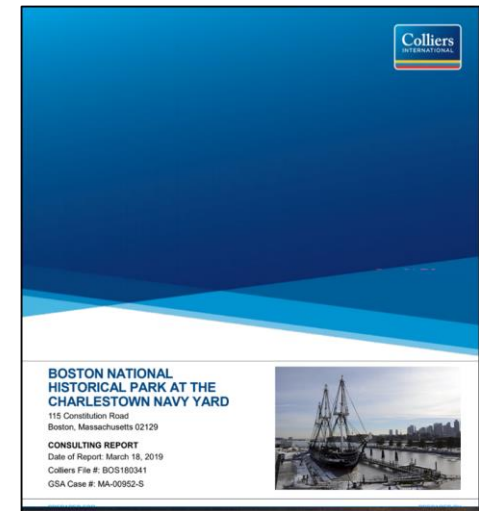
Charlestown Community Cruise

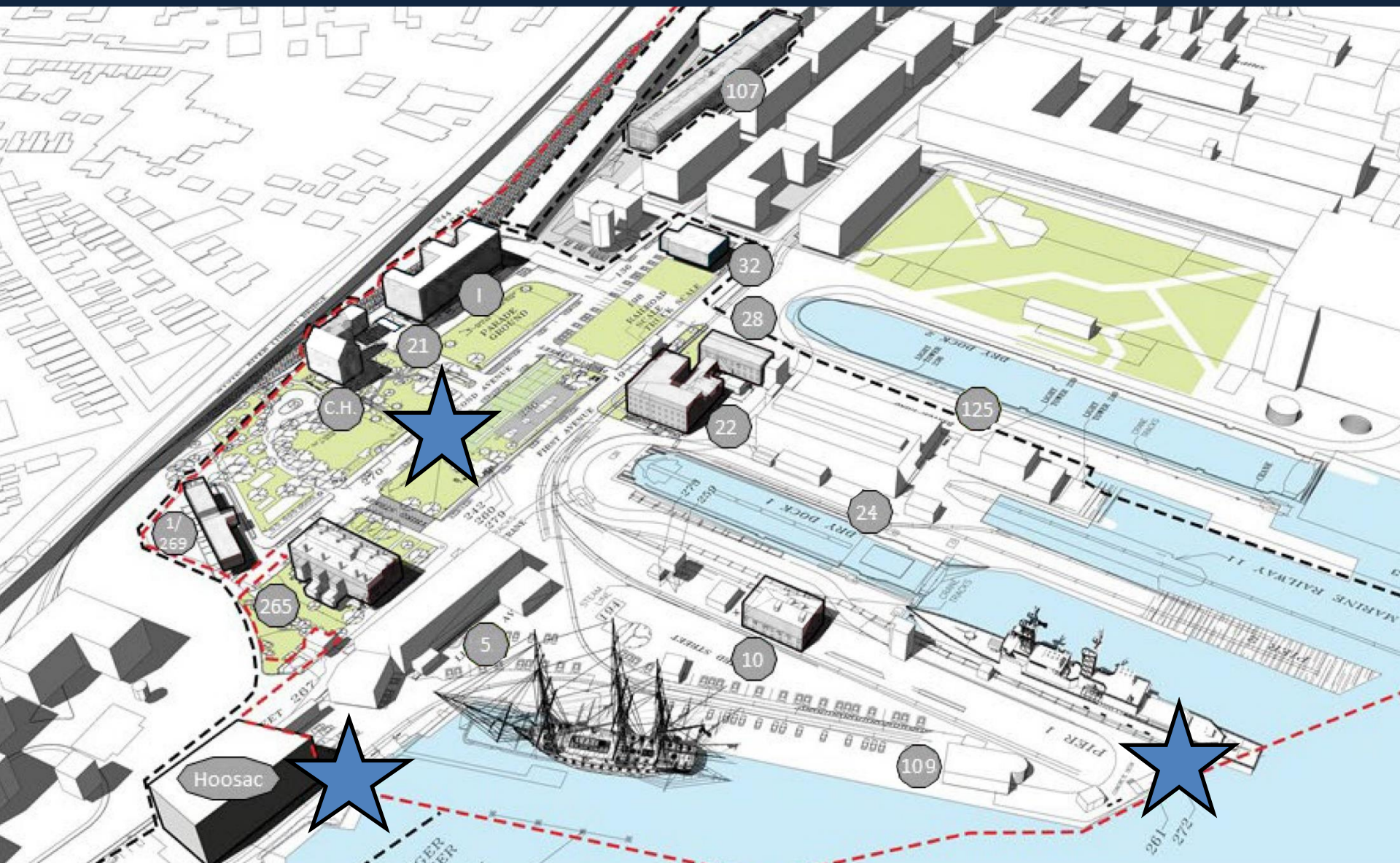
Public Law 116-152

Landmark conservation legislation will use revenues from energy development to provide up to **\$1.9 billion a year for five years** to provide needed maintenance for critical facilities and infrastructure in our national parks, forests, wildlife refuges, recreation areas, and American Indian schools.

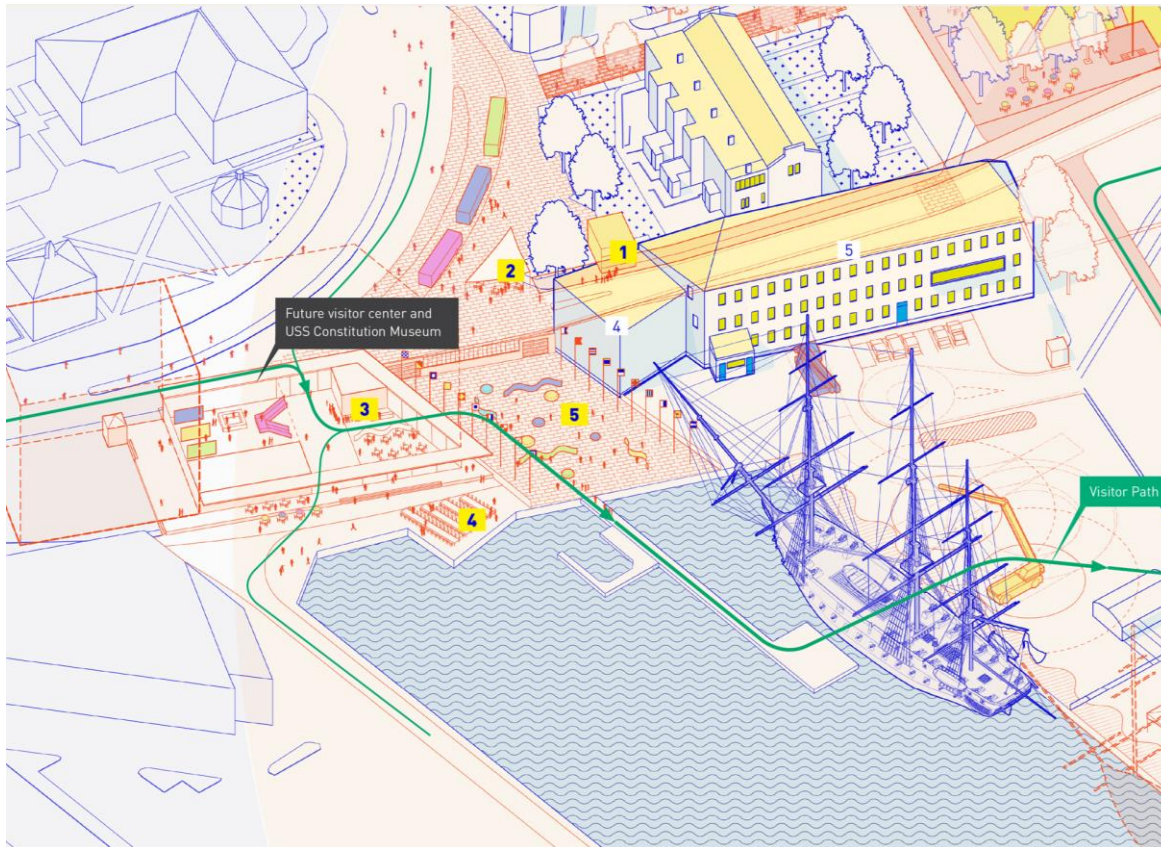


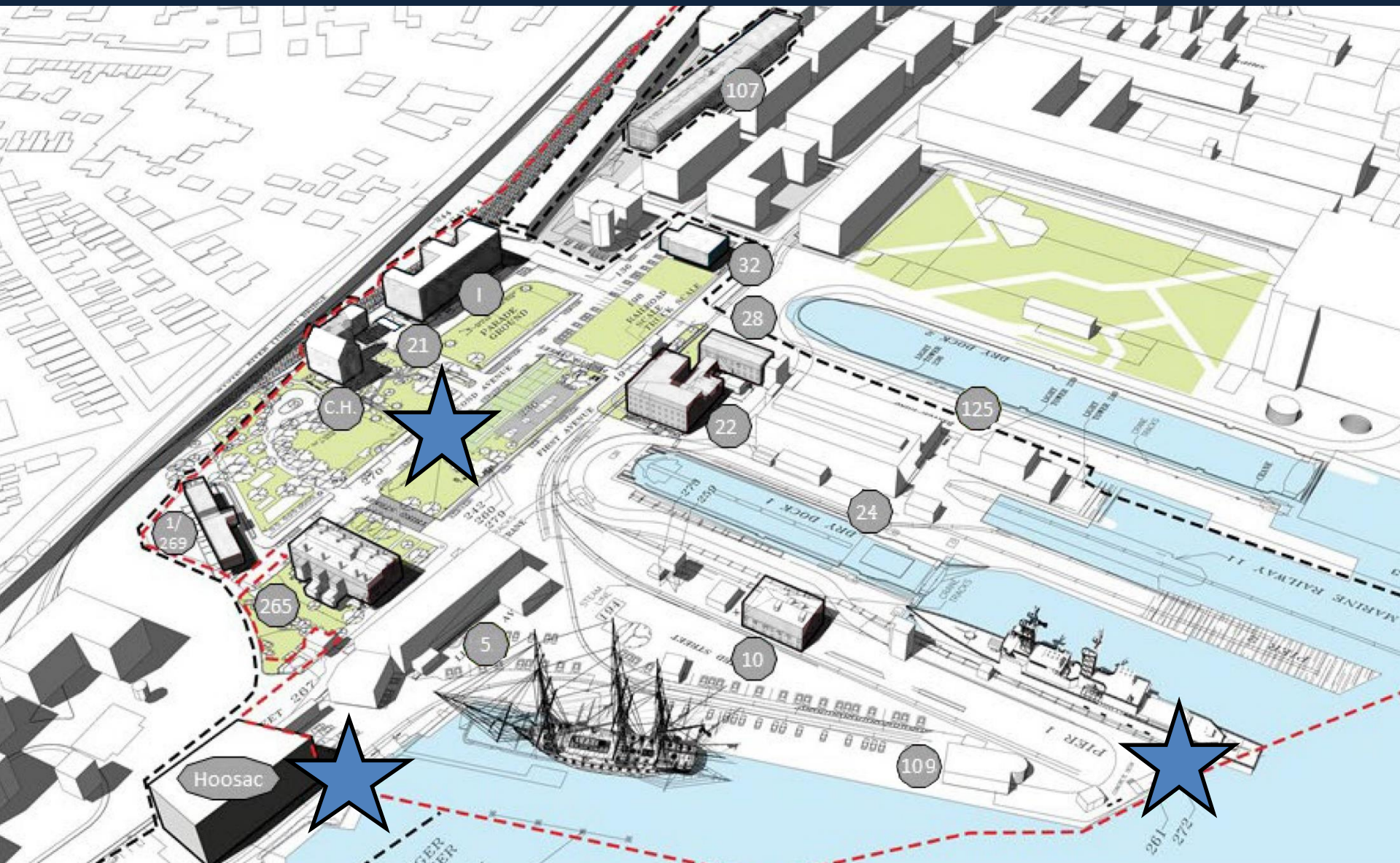

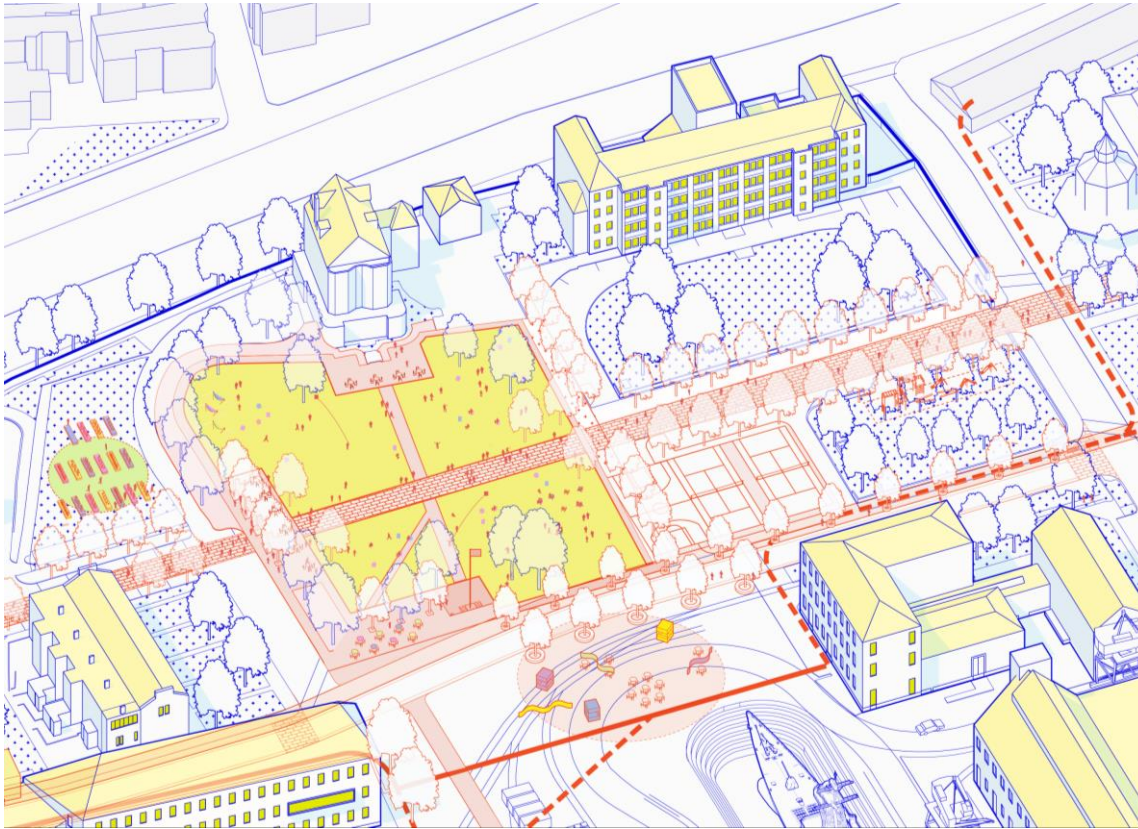
Preliminary Project Concepts



New Visitor Center & USS Constitution Museum



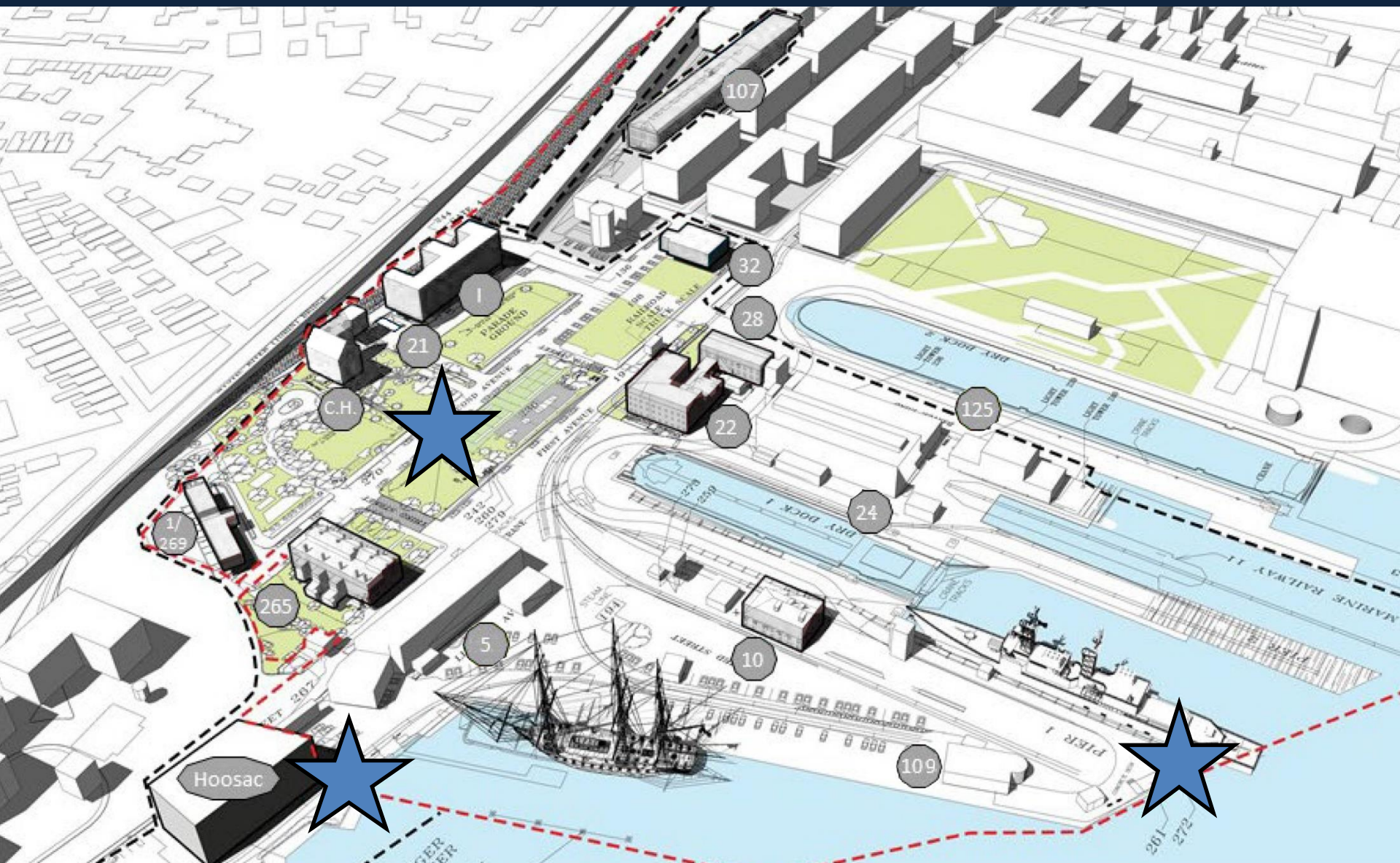


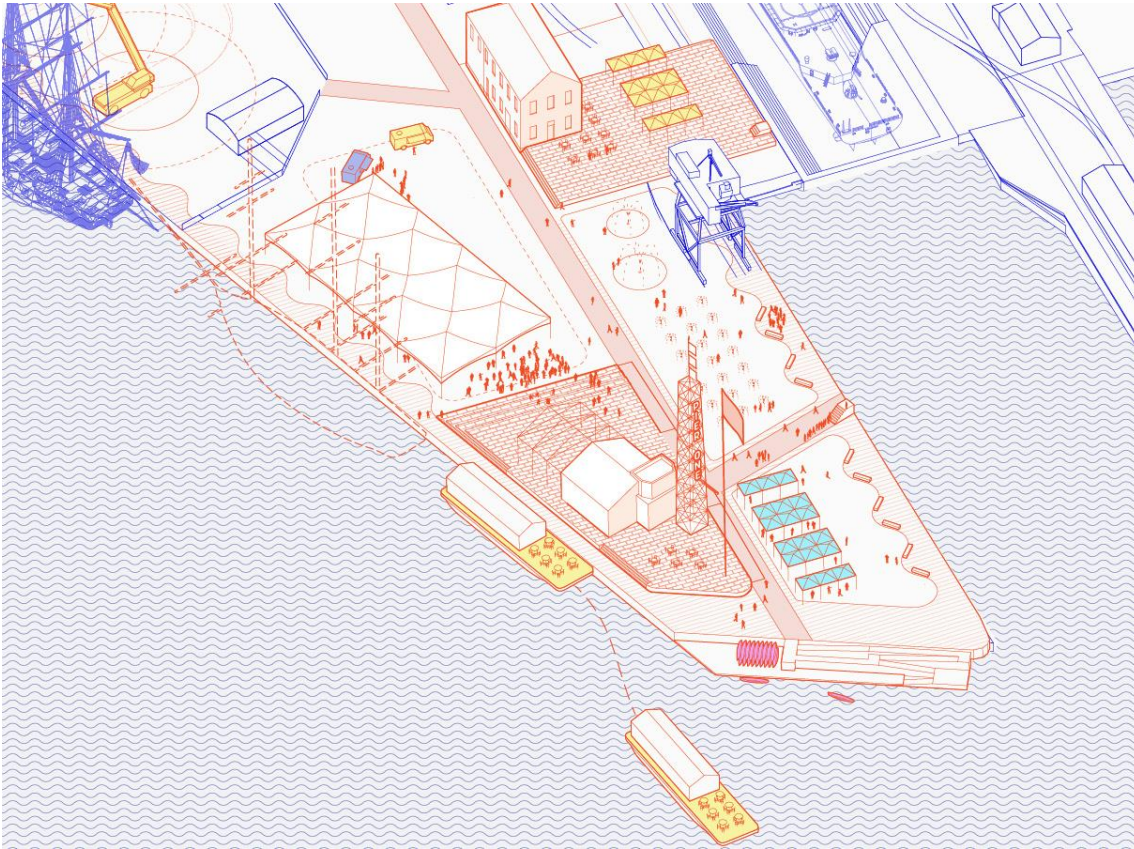
